COVID-19 Lockdown Update - Laptops, Mass Testing, Year 11 and Lockdown Clubs Re:

It has been a few days since I wrote to you so I thought it would be a good time to do so and keep you updated with what is happening at BBS.

Firstly, we would like to apologise if there was any disruption to your child's learning yesterday – there was an external network issue that affected programs such as Teams. I think having network issues from time to time is something that we are all getting used to with remote learning and working from home although it can still be very frustrating! Please be assured that as soon as we are aware of a problem, our IT teams work hard with the Telford and Wrekin IT teams to resolve the issue. We will always try and get the communication out to families as soon as possible so that you are aware too.

Please remind your child that even though Teams may not work from time to time, it does not mean there is no work to do. As mentioned in previous communication, websites such as Bedrock Learning, Hegarty Maths, BBC Bitesize or reading a book are all excellent things to be engaged with while you wait for the network to run again! There are also many more useful website links on the school website under the 'curriculum' tab that will aid learning.

<u>Laptops: Laptops from the DfE for our FSM families and Laptop Scheme</u>

We were delighted to receive the 46 laptops we were due to receive from the Department for Education in the Autumn term on Friday. We look forward to families with the highest level of need receiving them soon.

Since before Christmas, we have been looking at the logistics of running a laptop scheme at BBS, where families can pay for the laptop over a number of months. We sent out a survey earlier this week to see if families would be interested and we have already had over 400 responses! Thank you very much! Mass Testing at School

In my letter dated 6th January 2021, I informed families of some of the questions I had about mass testing in schools and the accuracy of the lateral flow tests. It is interesting to note that the DfE removed the template information letter that they had sent to schools to use with parents/carers last week. The letter was described as 'highly misleading' by the Professor of Digital Computation at Imperial College London, as it implied that the test is 99.68% accurate when it is not (it is 99.68% accurate in picking up negative tests, not positive ones).

I am delighted to say however, that I have a meeting scheduled with the Department for Education tomorrow morning where I am hoping the questions I have, and I know many families will also have, will be answered. I will update you as soon as I can once the meeting has taken place.
