
On behalf of the school, the local authority and Paveways builders we would like to take this opportunity to thank all students and parents for your patience and understanding through the refurbishment process.






Year 7 Virtual Author Visit

We had a virtual author visit from Catherin Johnson this week for Year 7, and some of our students have written up a review.

"Yesterday, after school, me and some Year 7s video-called the author of Sawbones, Catherine Johnson. She spoke to us about herself, her family and her homeplace. We asked her some questions as well:

Student: How did you get inspiration for Loveday and Ezra in your novel? Author: I thought back about the clothing and wanted a female character for that time period – and for her to be a very courageous person"

It is packed full with gothic writing and the life of a historical surgeon in the 1800s. Everyone has thoroughly enjoyed it. She had some very useful advice on the thought process of being a writer, explaining the dedication, hard work, confidence and not being afraid to edit which helps a lot. Catherine also made some great recommendations for any fans of her books or aspiring authors. She recommends 'The Italian Boy', 'The Lords of the Horizon' and 'Dr Johnson's London'.




Youth Speaks
