## **Burton Borough Community**

We want Burton Borough to be a Positive, Polite and Proud community where students work hard, play hard and achieve success. Everyone in the community contributes to this. Every week we are focusing on a different aspect of behaviour and reiterating to students why it is important and what we expect to see in school.

Our focus for next week is **Uniform.** Wear your uniform with PRIDE We want students at BBS to be proud to be part of our school community. When students wear their uniform correctly, it demonstrates this pride and shows that they are striving to set high standards for themselves. We are asking students to achieve 4 basic expectations of unform next week:



- 1. No hoodies on school site (including school field and playground if it is cold, students should be wearing a coat.)
- 2. No trainers
- 3. No leggings
- 4. Ties must be worn

We would like your support in achieving these high standards. Please can you check your child's uniform meets these guidelines. If they do not have a tie, please can you replace it. Where possible, please check that your child is wearing their uniform correctly before they leave home. If you have any concerns about unform, please talk to your small school team who may be able to support you. We will be checking uniform daily in tutor time and tutors will be contacting you if uniform is not correct. There will be sanctions for students who do not respond to requests to improve their unform.

#### **Be POLITE**

Last week, we spoke to students about the important of being polite to all members of the school community. This includes the staff, their peers and members of the community that they meet on their journey to and from school. We expect students to respond politely to reasonable requests. We request the use of basic manners, such as please and thank you. We believe that school is a much more positive, and happy place for everyone when students get these basic manners right.

## **POSITIVE learning environment**

We have also reinforced to students that mobile phones should not be seen on the school site. This includes during social times and before the start of school. We know that the use of social media can have a negative impact on our young people, and this can ultimately impact their learning during the school day. By reinforcing that mobile phones should be turned off and away, we allow students to focus on their learning whilst they are in school. Please reinforce this with your children.

#### University of Oxford Taster Day, Thursday May 11th

Over the past few years we have cultivated a link with University College at the University of Oxford. This has led to their school liaison officer visiting the school, sharing resources and advice with regard to higher education and, now, the opportunity to visit the College as part of a taster day. I am pleased to let you know that we are organising a trip to University College for 15 students in Year 10 on Thursday 11th May. This is a fantastic opportunity to give some of our students a sense of the intellectual and physical environment of one of the finest universities in the world. Our itinerary will look something like this:

10:30 – Arrival and 'Welcome to Oxford' at University College

11.00am – 'Oxford Explained' Talk

12.00pm – Packed Lunch in the University College Dining Hall

12.45pm - Tour of University College

1.15pm – Q & A with current Undergraduate Students

1.45pm – Classroom activity (subject taster sessions or a facilitated trip to a museum)

2.45 - Conclusion and travel home

We will be travelling on the school minibus and will need to leave school at 8:15 am on the 11th of May in order to ensure we arrive at the university on time for an 11 am start. The day will finish at approximately 2:45pm so we expect to arrive back at school by 5:30 pm.

I know that this will be a popular opportunity and as such will need to enable all students who wish to go to have the chance of a place. I ask that students send me a letter expressing their interest and in which they explain what ways they hope to benefit from the day. They can send this via email (tom.allen@taw.org.uk), by bringing in the physical letter or send it to me via Teams. The deadline for this will be Wednesday 3rd of May. If your child applied for the trip in October, they will not need to write a new letter and will just need to let me know they still wish to be considered for a place.

I hope that you will agree that this is an exciting opportunity and I look forward to receiving expressions of interest in the coming week.
