

#### Government guidance for students with mild illnesses

We have been asked by the Department for Education (DfE) to provide you with a clinical public health perspective on mild illnesses and school attendance. See below:


"We are aware that Covid-19 pandemic may have caused some parents to feel less confident with assessing whether their child is well enough to be in school so we have laid out some information which we hope you will find helpful.


There is wide agreement amongst health professionals and educational professionals that school attendance is vital to the life chances children and young people. Being in school improves health, wellbeing and socialisation throughout the life course. The greatest benefits come from children and young people attending school regularly.

It is usually appropriate for parents are carers to send their children into school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms; a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent into school if they have a temperature of 38 degrees C or above. Please see <u>NHS</u> 'is my child too ill for school?' guidance for further information.

In addition to raspatory illnesses, we are aware that more children may be absent from school due to symptoms of anxiety than before the pandemic. Worry and mild or moderate anxiety, whilst sometimes difficult emotions, can be a normal part of growing up for many children and young people. Being in school can often help alleviate the underlying issues. A prolonged period of absence is likely to heighten a child's anxiety about attending in the future, rather than reduce it. DfE has published useful guidance on mental health issues affecting a pupil's attendance and those who are experiencing persistent symptoms can be encouraged to access additional support.


